You are hereby authorized to join in Marriage Wesley Marion King of Morris County, aged 22 years, and Phebe Boyer of Morris County, aged 22 years; and of this License you will make due return to my office within thirty days.

And which said Marriage License was afterwards, to wit, on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of January A. D. 1877, returned to said Probate Judge, with the following certificate endorsed thereon, to wit:

## HOME, SWEET HOME: GUILFORD, CONN.

### GUILFORD: An overview and short history

Only a few years after the Pilgrims settled in the Bay Colony, the Rev. Henry Whitfield and his followers left London to establish new lives in Connecticut. Listed as a passenger on the *St. John* as it set sail May 20, 1639, under the command of Capt. Richard Russell, was "John Parmelin," the Parmelee family's 55-year-old patriarch, who was on his way to join his son, John Jr., who had sailed to America four years before aboard the *Elizabeth and Ann*.

(No members of either man's family are listed on the passenger lists although the wives and children of other men are.)

Before that first ship of the three-vessel Whitfield fleet arrived at New Haven in early July, the men aboard pledged their lives and futures toward the good of the entire party by signing the Plantation Covenant. John Sr.'s name -- though not his signature -- appears on the document dated June 1, 1639.

The Whitfield party -- and the reunited Parmelees -- stayed only a few weeks in New Haven before setting out with their dogs, cattle and furniture to establish a plantation to the east at Manunkatuck that September. The newcomers made their initial land purchase from a sachem squaw, Shaumpishuh, with the Pequots consenting on Sept. 29/Oct. 9, 1639. Land from the Ruttawoo [East River] to Agicomook [Stone Creek] was signed over to the Englishmen for a wagonload of trinkets:

12 coats  
12 hatchets  
12 hoes  
12 knives and an equal number of spoons  
12 fathoms of wampum  
12 pairs of shoes and pairs of stockings  
2 English coats  
12 glasses  
12 hats  
4 kettles  
and 12 porringers

The deed remained in the hands of the planters until they formed a church and decided how to divide the land. The planters laid out their home lots, parceling out land long ago cleared by Native Americans for their cornfields. Allotments were made in accordance with wealth: Every 100 pounds of their estate brought the family five acres of upland and six of salt meadow. No family was allowed more than 500 pounds' equivalence nor less than 50 pounds'. After additional purchases were made in 1641, '45, '63 and '86, the settlement comprised more than 53,000 acres, including today's town of Madison [East Guilford].

The original is in the New Haven Probate Records The handwriting reads, "Know all men by these presents, I John Parmely of Newhaven being very sicke in body but prfect in minde, doe Institute and ordaine this my last will and Testament in manner and forme following I doe give and bequeathe to my beloued wife Elizabeth Parmely my house-lott and all my whole Estate for her to enjoy and possesse without molestation during the whole time of her life. "And after her decease I doe give and bequeath half of my house and lott to my sonne, John Parmile of Guilford, the other half, one quarter to my Grandchild Nathaniel Parmile, the sonne of John Parmile of Guilford. And the other quarter part I give to my wife to dispose to her sonne, Stephen [Bradley], if she see cause and for those goods which shall be left at the dease my will is that my daughter Hannah Johnson the wife of John Johnson of Newhaven, and her dauter Ellen Allan ye wife of John Allen of Newhaven, should have ye greater part equally divided betwixt them and what doth remain I doe leave to her discretion to dispose as she pleaseth. " There is no mention of his daughter Mary, who married Dennis Crampton. Neither John's signature nor his mark appear on the document.

THE *PARMELEE* FAMILY HOMEPAGE /  
THE WILL OF JOHN JR. (1612-1687/88)

The will of John Parmelee Jr. of Guilford, Conn., dated Dec. 20, 1684, disposed of property inventoried on Feb. 8, 1687/88, at 259 pounds, 4 shillings and is signed with his mark. It appears below on two pages. [Click here to download a full-size copy of Page One](#) — of Page Two.



After leaving his widow 20 pounds, he divided his home lot between sons John and Joshua; gave his land in Nut Plains, an area just north of the central village, and several other parcels to John; and gave Joshua the land in Nut Plains that he had purchased from John Goodrich. He gave sons Caleb and Isaac 5 pounds each; daughter Hannah 2 pounds; son Stephen 7 pounds, and his other children — John, Priscilla and Joel 10 pounds each. He also designated that his youngest sons would receive land on the Great Plain when they reached 21, his daughter, when she reached 18. His oldest child, Nathaniel, preceded him in death.

Dear Clara

The change of name looks to me as tho' you have remarried. Congratillatons and best wishes. I don't know how much good this story will do you because there is so little of it I could prove. Most of it came by way of mouth from grandma Phebe King, aunts, uncles and cousins. Any way the is the way I have put it together.

Anne Scott was born in Ireland on Feb. 17, 1819. She married John S. Patterson Jan 1, 1838. Belle or 'Isabella' was born about 1842 in Philadelphia, Penn. One winter John Patterson was out of work and walked the streets in snow & cold looking for work till he died of exposure, probably pneumonia. Anne's mother, Mary Scott died March 16, 1851 and her father Andrew Scott died March 16, 1865. I do not know what year they came to America.

Anne married George Boyer January 1, 1850. George W. Boyer was born to Anne Patterson Boyer and George Boyer on September 28, 1850, and died November 20, 1920 at the St. Francis Hospital in Wichita, Kansas.

Ellen Elizabeth Boyer was born Feb. 25, 1853 died Feb. 8, 1898. Phoebe Anne Boyer (my grandmother) was born June 3, 1855 died 1946.

George Boyer Sr. was recruited for army duty during the Civil War. He carried dead and wounded from the battle field, and suffered the rest of his life from overwork and exposure. Grandma Phebe always remembered hearing the cannons boom, when she was a little girl in Philadelphia. George and Anne Boyer must have left Philadelphia with their 4 children at the close of the war. I can't find where or when the Mc Sparrins came into the story, but it must have been at or before this time. I remember Grandma Phoebe saying something about Ohio, but they must not have been there long, for Anna Mc Sparrin was born in Indiana in 1866. Therefore I believe Belle Patterson and Will Mc Sparrin were married in Philadelphia not later than 1865 maybe earlier. I fell sure the Boyers and Mc Sparrins came west together. It appears they fallowed what later became highway 70 across the country. I have nothing yet to prove it but I believe they became acquainted with the Kings in Illinois.

The Boyers came to Pottawatami County Kansas from Effingham Illinois in 1866 or soon after and bought a farm 5 miles from Wheaton Kansas. Geo. Boyers health was very poor and Wesley Marion and Sylvester King both worked for him. The Kings cane to Kansas in 1872. In late 1873 Sylvester King and Ellen Boyer were married and the same year bought the Boyer farm. We think Geo. Boyer died there in 1873 or 4. Then Sylvester King sold the farm to Rufus King, a brother, and about 1886 came to Butler county Kansas.

It is thought the Mc Sparrins came to Butler county about 1880, or maybe sooner right after Geo. Boyer died, because it is known that Anne Boyer made her home with them, and that the Mc Sparrins owned a half section of land 2 miles south of Cassaday Kansas, in Sycamore township in 1885. This is where Anna Mc Sparrin and Joseph King were married by Reverend Mills on Nov. 30, 1887. When the Kings John, Sylvester, Wesley and Joseph came to Butler county in 1886 they settled near the McSparrins. Since Belle was half sister to Ellen Boyer King and Phebe Anne King, this probably had some thing to do with their coming to Butler county.

We know the Kings, Boyers and Mc Sparrins were neighbors in Pottowatami county, because Joseph and Anna played together and studied together when they were children. Cousin Jesse King remembers his grandmother Belle McSparrin talking about Joe and Anna sitting on the stair steps to study. That would have been after Joes mother died in 1873. Jesse's grandma Belle called Jesse 'Little Joe' because he looked so much like his father Joseph, when he was small.

Anne Patterson Boyer made the run into Okla. 1893 at the opening of the Cherokee Strip with the Mc Sparrins driving a wagon part time, as William Mc Sparrin rode on ahead on horse back to find a good location. The old homestead is 2 ½ miles Southwest of Goltry. I remember visiting Willie and Goldie when they still lived on the farm. We visited them again after they moved to Goltry, and later drove down again, but nobody was home. A neighbor said they had taken Goldie to the hospital the nite before, but he didn't know where. In a short time we heard of Goldie's death, and a few months later Willie died. I think that must have been 1965 or 6. I heard from their daughter Dorothy once, but then she never answered my letter. I am having my pictures of the old house and of great grandmothers grave copied. If you would like, I will send you on of each. She was buried not more than 500 yds. Northwest of the house. I've been told there was no cemetery near when she died in 1894.

I have tried to find out more about your fathers years with General Custer, but everywhere I have run up against a blank wall. One might learn more by writing to the National Archives in Washington D.C. I haven't done that.

I think I have told about all I know about the Boyer family. I believe Billes children are all dead. I know for sure Willie and Mary are.

I do have some more about the families of Ellen and Phobe, but from your letter I take it you are more interested in past than present. Sorry I don't have more proof.
