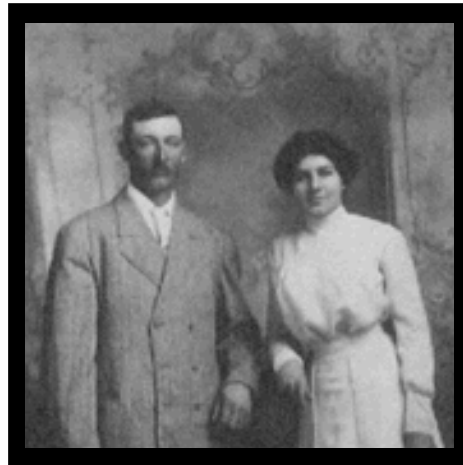

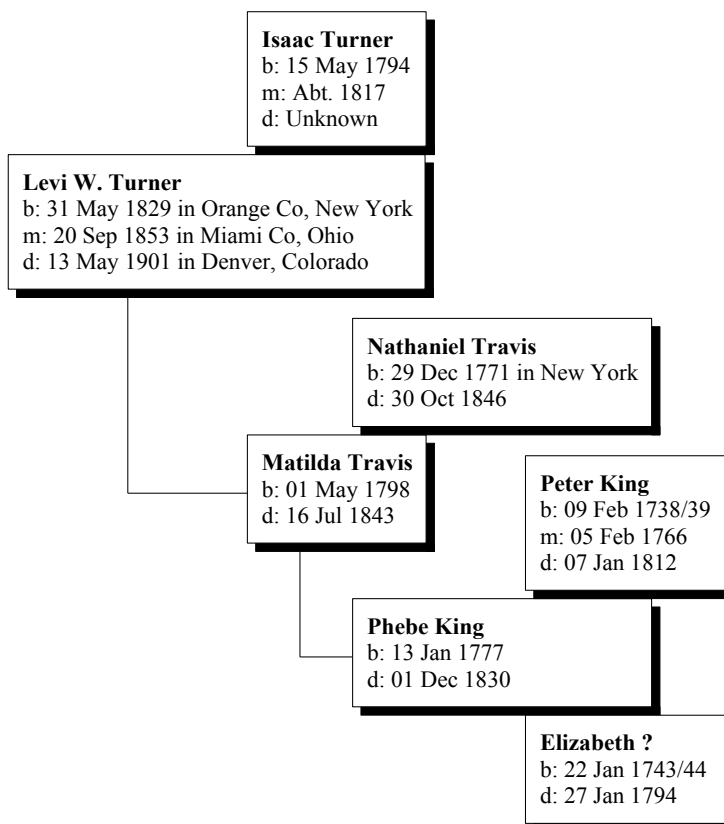

The history of Miami County, Ohio: Biographical Sketches:

Abraham and Lydia (Yount) Turner; he was born in Orange Co, N.Y., March 1, 1819. In the spring of 1842, he came emigrated to Indiana, where he operated a sawmill; April 6, 1843, he came to Frederickstown, and engaged in the same business. Dec 20, 1846, he was married to Lydia Yount, by whom he had eleven children; those living are Jennie, Belle, Sarah, John, Emma, Fremont, Lulu, Clifford and Mary; Eliza deceased. Mrs Turner was born in Montgomery Co, Ohio, June 15, 1826, and is a daughter of John and Nancy Yount, pioneers of the above named county. By occupation, Mr Turner was a carpenter and millwright. Belle, wife of ----, was born in this county June 12, 1849.

MONTGOMERY COUNTY.

Abraham Turner was born in Orange county, N. Y., in 1819, and was of New England ancestry. His father's children were George W., who died a soldier in the late Civil war; Levi, Daniel, Abraham, Elizabeth, Mary, Sarah and Jennie. Abraham Turner was by trade a carpenter and millwright. He came to Ohio, settling in Miami county when a young man, and in 1846, when he was twenty-eight years old, married Lydia Yount, who was born June 15, 1825, in Montgomery county. She was a daughter of John and Nancy (Insko) Yount, the former of whom came from one of the Carolinas to Ohio, where he became a prosperous and substantial farmer. He was engaged also in the distillery business in Little York and in the contracting business in Dayton. He died in Harrison township when seventy-one years old. His children were Daniel W., Mary, Jane, Lydia, Eliza, Sallie and Callie. Mr. Yount was one of the prominent men of his day, intelligent and influential. After their marriage Mr. and Mrs. Turner settled on the John Yount homestead. He then bought the mill property on the Stillwater above Milton, operated the mill for a few years, and then bought a farm in Miami county and there worked at his trade. His children were as follows: Mary J., Bell, Sallie, John, Fremont, Emma, Reeder, Lulu, Clifford and May.

Union Township

D. W. BOWMAN, merchant, Fidelity ; was born in Miami Co., Oct. 25, 1847, and is a son of Joseph and Mary Bowman ; his father was born in Tennessee in 1801, and, with his parents, came to, and settled in, Clark Co., Ohio, about 1812, where they lived some years, when he died, and Joseph, with his mother, removed to Montgomery Co., Ohio, where she died. Joseph's early life was passed on the farm, and when old enough, he engaged in selling goods, traveling from one point to another. He was a poor boy and his business career was begun on a capital of \$10, borrowed money. In 1826, he opened a little store in Frederick, which was stocked with goods brought from a distance, on the back of a pony. Being of an energetic and progressive spirit, he soon overcame many of the disadvantages attached to poverty, and gradually ascended in the scale of prosperity, until he had accumulated a large property, laying the foundation of a business which exists to this day. He was very benevolent, gave largely to the poor, never turning any from his door who deserved his sympathy and help. At his death, his estate amounted to \$100,000. He died in November, 1871, aged 71 years and 7 days. Mr. Bowman married in 1821, Mary Sheets, who bore him eleven children, five of whom are living—O. P., J. W., D. W., Ella and Jennie. The deceased are Ann, Caroline, Jacob R., Elwood, Harriet and John. Her mother was born June 6, 1790, and died Sept. 12, 1839 ; her father died Aug. 12, 1851. They were married in August, 1807, and were the parents of five children, two living—Bethany and Mary. The deceased, Daniel, Perry and Nancy. Mrs. Bowman was born in

Montgomery Co., Ohio, March 27, 1808, is living, and resides in Frederickstown. Our subject was reared to mercantile pursuits ; his long experience enabling him to successfully manage his large business. His education was largely attained in the common schools, and in the Normal School in Lebanon. From 1865 to 1871, he was a partner with his father, and at his death assumed management of the business, which is large and increasing, so much so that his cotemporaries find his trade invulnerable, and can survive but a short time. Nov. 24, 1869, he was married to Belle, an accomplished daughter of Abraham and Lydia (Yount) Turner. Her father was born in Orange Co., N. Y., March 1, 1819. Shawangunk Kill.—This stream runs from South to North through the central portion of the town, but furnishes no hydraulic power, and is the only one worth naming. No town in the county, unless it be Goshen, is so destitute of brooks and ponds. The etymology of Shawangunk has been given.

REVOLUTIONARY PLEDGE.

Before leaving the town of Deerpark and her younger sister Mount Hope, we place before the reader a list of the names who signed it in Mamacoting. Up to and till after the war of the Revolution, the district of country then known as Mamacoting, extended from Rochester in Ulster down along the valley to Minisink, and included the area now covered by Deerpark. While many names—such as Swartwout, Depue, Cuddeback, Van Inwegen, De Witt, Gumaer, etc.—will be recognised as belonging to Deerpark, others on the list will be found belonging to the present town of Mamakating. We preserve the original spelling as found on the record, and as we cannot distinguish the names which properly belong to Orange from those which may belong to Sullivan and Ulster, we must leave the citizens of the town to select their own patriot ancestors.

From an inspection of all the returns made by the Committees of Safety throughout the colonies in 1775, we pronounce old Mamacoting the banner town for Revolutionary patriotism; for the President of the Committee, John Young, returned to Congress that the pledge was “unanimously signed by all the freeholders and inhabitants of the precinct, June 26, 1775,” which was not the fact in any other instance.

CORRECTION.—In our statement of the number of forts ordered to be erected in Deerpark by the Committee of Safety in 1778, in what was called the "Upper Neighborhood," and in saying that there were none in the "Lower Neighborhood," we were in error in both particulars. Finchville - Situated on the west bank of the Shawangunk Kill in the western part of Mount Hope and close under the mountain... The name is from the families of James and David G. Finch, old residents in that vicinity... John Finch, the first emigrant, came from Horse Neck, Connecticut, and settled at Goshen, and the family tradition is, that he was the first grown person buried in the grave yard of the Goshen Church. The name of his wife is not known. A son, James Finch, Sr. was born there, and married to Catharine Gale by Priest Kerr. Shortly before the Revolutionary War they moved to the vicinity of Finchville. James Finch, Jr was born 25 Jul 1768 and died 7 Dec 1843. He married Sarah _____? born 23 Sep 1772, died 1 Dec 1843. They had ten children most of whom died in 1843 of a "bilious congestive fever ending in typhoid."

Deerpark - Peter E Gumaar was born in the town of Deerpark at or near Fort Gumaar, 28 May 1771, and died 18 Dec 1869 at the age of 98 years and six months. His parents were Ezekiel Gumaar and Naomi Low. He was a descendant of French Huguenots. He was a surveyor as well as a farmer and surveyed most of the lands in the town of Deerpark and also of adjoining towns. Mr. Gumaar's wife is not named. They had the following children:

ORANGE COUNTY, NEW YORK

Established towns in Orange County, New York in 1846:

Bloomington - Erected 1799 - taken from Cornwall which was erected in 1788 as New Cornwall and in 1797, changed to Cornwall.

Chester - Erected 1845 - taken from Goshen, Warwick, Monroe, and Bloomington.

Crawford - Erected 1823 - taken from Montgomery.

DEER PARK - Erected in 1798 as part of Ulster County and taken from Manakating.

Goshen - Erected in 1788.

Hamptonburgh - Erected in 1830 - taken from Wallkill, Goshen, Montgomery, Bloomington, and New Windsor.

Monroe - Erected 1799 - taken from Cornwall. The original name was Cheesecocks, afterwards in 1802, it was Southfield, and in 1808, Monroe.

Montgomery - Erected in 1788.

Mount Hope - Erected in 1825 - taken from Wallkill, Deer Park, and Minisink. The original name was Calhoun.

Newburgh - Erected in 1788.

New Windsor - Erected in 1788.

Wallkill - Erected in 1788.

Minisink - Erected in 1788.

Warwick - Erected in 1788. - (All towns of this date, 1788, were organized originally as part of Ulster County except Goshen, Cornwall, Warwick, and Monroe)

ULSTER HUGUENOTS

The Ulster Huguenots were a fragment of that resolute band (Christian) of 50,000 who fled France in the 17th century to escape the rack and wheel of a persecution for conscience sake, to which, no parallel is found in history. The Edict of Nance had promised them safety; and though they were for a time apparently restored to that liberty which they so deeply prized, yet their grievances at length became insupportable, and they were compelled to fly for safety, some to Switzerland, others to Germany, Holland, and England. The eyes of many of these sufferers were soon turned to the New World. They looked here for rest from strife and persecution - for a land where they might live according to the dictates of temperance and virtue; and worship their Creator as they thought appropriate. Many of these exiles settled in the valleys of Ulster - The names of twelve of these early settlers were: Lewis Dubois; Christian Dayo; Abraham Hasbrouck; Andre Lefebvre; Jean Hasbrouck, Pierre Dayo; Lewis Bevier; Anthoine Crispell, Abraham Dubois; Hugar Frere; Isaac Dubois; and Leman Lefebvre.

KING PETER ()—From Bridge Hampton to Saybrook, in Sept., 1776, by Capt. Zebulon Stow (C. 144); and, same month, to Middletown, with six passengers, by Capts. Eliphalet Redfield and Benjamin King, Jr. (C. 90) He signed the Association, in 1775. (H. 10) He probably served in Conn. (G. 93)

Census of 1776: Males—above 16 years, 1; under 16, 1. Females—above 16, 1; under 16, 4. (A. 54)

KING RICHARD 6 (Son of William, below; brother of William, Jr., below)—From East Hampton to Lyme, probably. On Aug. 22, 1778, he receipted for the claim of his brother William, Jr. (C. 92) On Mar. 17, 1779, he receipted for the claim of his father, William King. (C. 93) He signed the Association, in 1775. (H. 28) He may have served with the Dutchess Minute Men (G. 70); or in the 4th Ulster. ("N. Y. in the Rev'n," p. 265)

Census of 1776: Males—above 16 years, 1; under 16, 1. Females—above 16, 1. (A. 52) He was b. Dec. 10, 1755. (Liber E. MS. Southold Town Rec.)

Richard King

KING SAMUEL 6 ()—From Bridge Hampton to Middletown; whence, on May 15, 1783, he petitioned for release from the gaol in which he had been confined for going to L. I. without a permit. (E. 188) It may be that he was in Dutchess Co., N. Y., in 1781. (B. 6) He signed the Association, in 1775. (H. 10) He served in Col. Smith's Regt. (G. 7, 29); and probably in Conn. (G. 93)

He returned to L. I. after the War; and the one from Dutchess Co. must have been another man. (Miss Mary Josephine Briggs)

Census of 1776: Males—above 16 years, 1; under 16, 2. Females—above 16, 1; under 16, 2. (A. 54)

His ancestry is not determined; but he is placed in the 6th gen. from William 1 as the gen. to which it is probable that he belonged.

His dau., Lydia 7, b. in 1763; m. James Brooks, of Haddam, Conn., one of Washington's Guards; d. at Laporte, O., Dec. 3, 1847. 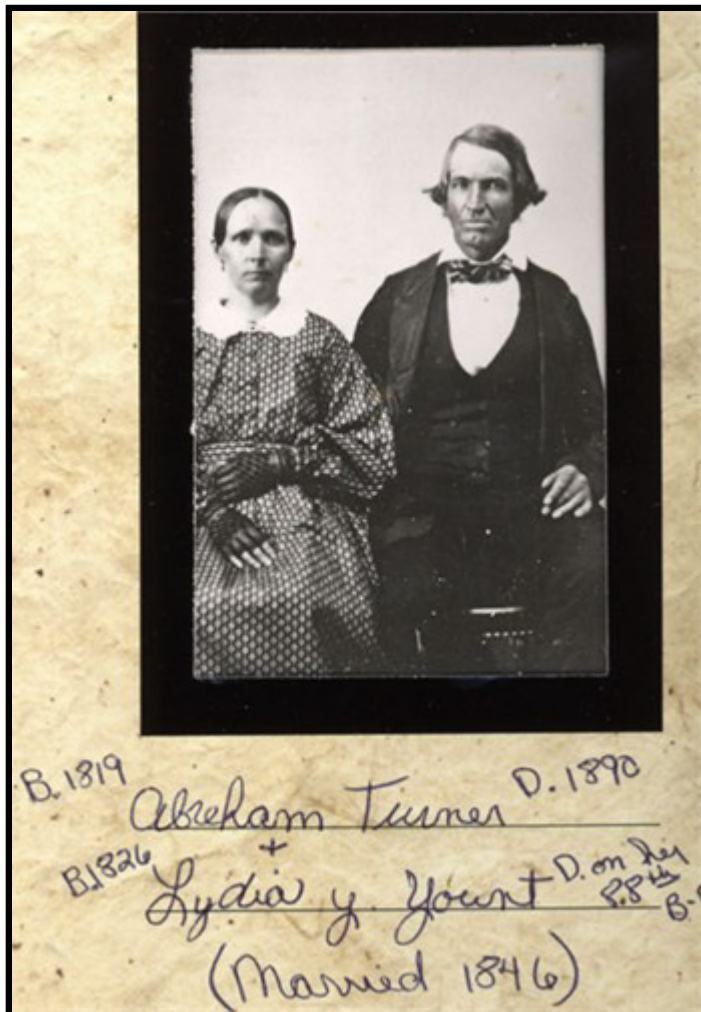

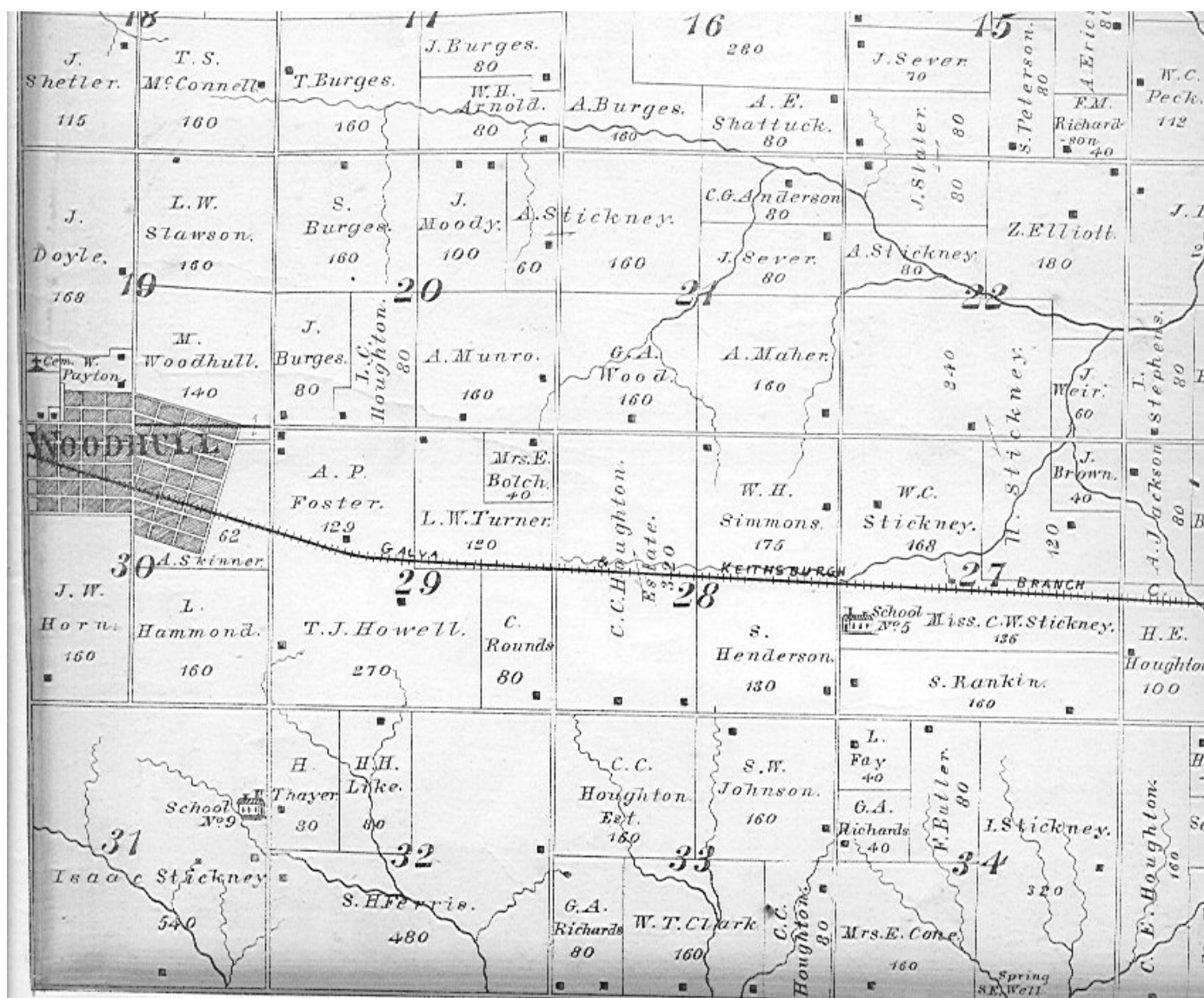

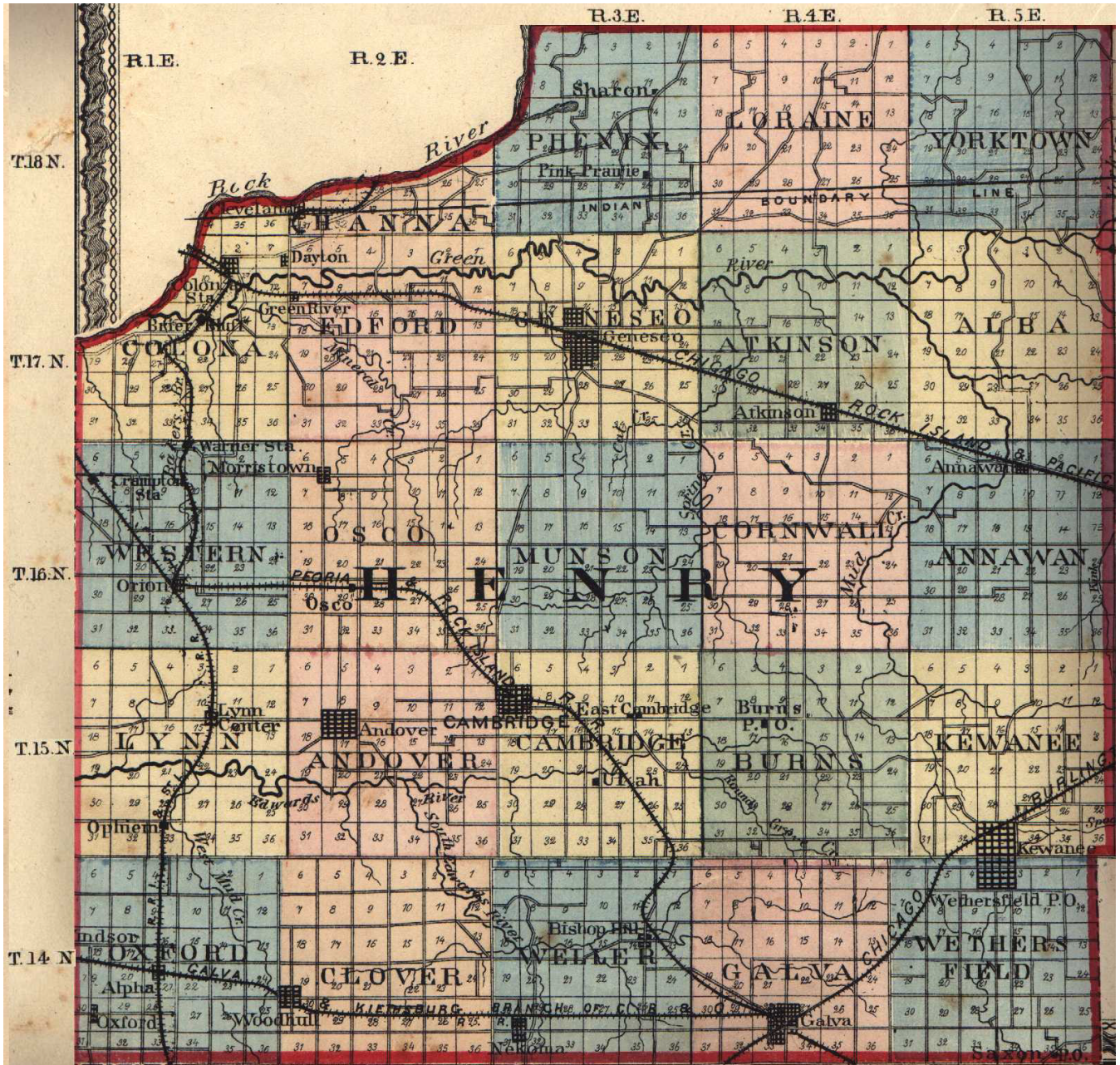

He is a son of Harry and Elizabeth (Hall) Thayer, also natives of New York State and New Hampshire respectively. The subject of this sketch remained at home under the influence of his parents until he attained the age of 19 years, in the meantime assisting on the farm and receiving an education, attending the Lima Seminary.

After leaving home, he came to Knox Co., Ill., and engaged to work on a farm on shares for four years, at the end of which time he left for Clover Township, this county, where he purchased 80 acres on section 36, his present residence, and later 20 acres adjoining, which he has under excellent cultivation.

William R. Tracy. The following is the sketch of one of the promising and enterprising young men of Oxford Township, who is engaged in general farming on section 20: He is one of the very few farmers or business men of the county who was born in this section of the State. In reading over the personal sketches of the active men of the county of to-day, one is impressed with the large number who were born in the East or a foreign country, and the

fewness of those who are natives of Illinois. Mr. Tracy was born in Richland Grove Township, Mercer Co., Ill., Jan. 26, 1852. His parents were Joab and Mary J. (Coon) Tracy, natives of Montgomery Co., Ind. They came to Illinois and located in Mercer County in 1851. There the elder Tracy rented a farm and for three years cultivated it. He then came into Henry County and purchased 160 acres of land in Lynn Township. He has subsequently bought 1,200 acres, and is still living in Lynn.

William R. remained at home until 21 years of age, enjoying excellent advantages for an education. The winter previous to his leaving home, he taught school. He then for six years had the use of one of his father's farms. At the end of that period he bought a farm in his native township, Mercer County, of 160 acres. After living upon it for five years, he sold out and came into Oxford Township, this county, where he now lives and owns 300 acres of land. W., our subject, was born May 31, 1829, received in his boyhood and youth a common-school education, and at the age of 15 years he left home and learned the carriage and wagon maker's trade, serving an apprenticeship of three years. Joab Tracy. The gentleman whose name heads this personal sketch resides on section 32, Lynn Township, and is one of the largest land-owners of the county. He was born in Montgomery Co., Ind., May 26, 1831. His father, Jesse Tracy, was a native of Kentucky and of a family of four sons and four daughters, who lost their father when Jesse was quite young. He lived in Kentucky until after his marriage, which event occurred in ~~Massa~~ ^{Mass} County, and the lady who joined her fortunes with his was Nancy Hayden, also a Kentuckian by birth and ancestry. After their marriage they went to Ohio, where, engaged in farming, they lived for some years. During their sojourn in the Buckeye State, four children were born to them. All of the children are married excepting one, and are all well-to-do and prosperous farmers.

Joab was about 20 years of age when the family moved to Peoria Co., Ill., his father having previously died in Montgomery County. He was born April 8, 1795, and died on the 16th of September, 1845, when Joab was 14 years old. He lived with his mother in

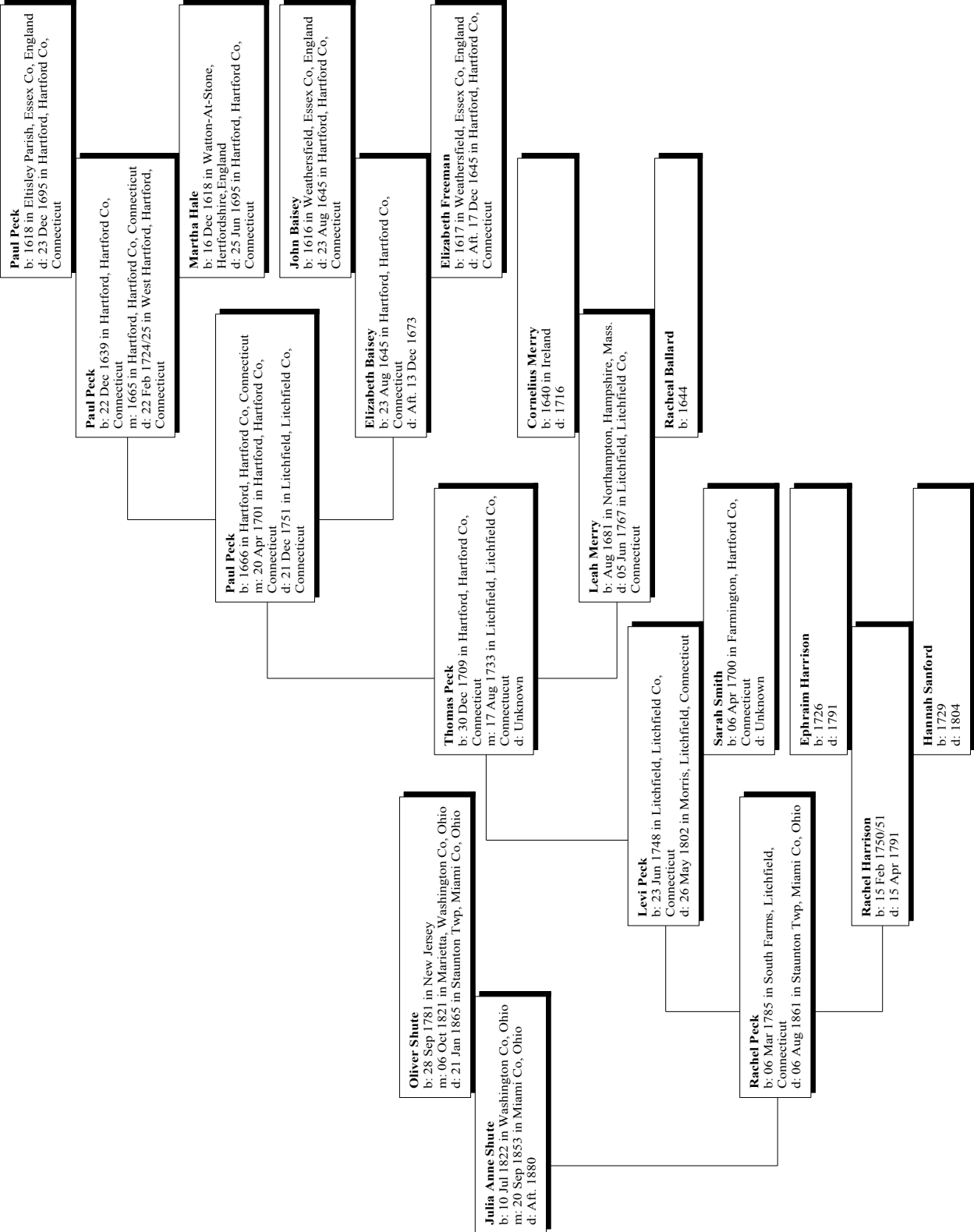
Peoria County for some years, when they went to Champaign Co. Ill., where, Aug. 17, 1859, the mother died. Our subject had not lived quite a year in Peoria County, when he celebrated his marriage. This event, however, took place in Montgomery County, his old home. Miss Mary J., daughter of Hiram and Nancy (LaValley) Coon, was the lady of his choice. This important event in their lives occurred Jan. 5, 1851. Mrs. Coon, the mother of Mrs. Tracy, died when the latter was five years of age. Between this period and her marriage, she lived with strangers.

About one year subsequent to his marriage, Mr. T. came to Mercer County, and for three years lived in Richland Grove Township. In 1855, he came into Lynn Township, and entered 160 acres of land upon which he began to make improvements, and where he intended to establish a home. This quarter section, which he still has in possession, was never owned by any person save himself and "Uncle Sam." He made improvements upon this place, and soon began to add to first purchase. He has continued to make such accessions until he now owns 940 acres in Lynn Township, 320 acres in Osco Township, 80 acres in Oxford and 17½ acres in Richland Grove Township. His farms, as a whole, are mostly under the plow, and upon his home place he has first-class farm buildings, and a large and commodious residence.

Politically, Mr. T. is a Democrat of the first water, and has been since he voted for Franklin Pierce. He takes an active part in local politics, but declines any official position.

The record of the ten children born to Mr. and Mrs. T. is given as follows: William R. is married and resides on a farm in Oxford Township, and is the father of two children, Grace and William; James A. is married and lives in Osco Township. The former married Mary D. Barrett, and the latter Lena Moltrope; Willis married Orlena S. Reynolds, lives in Lynn Township, and has two children—Edith and Alvah; Ellen is the wife of Charles Kinsey, and lives in Richland Grove Township, and the mother of two children—Emma and an infant; Catherine is the wife of Allen Sayre, of Rural Township, Rock Island County, and is the mother of one child—Harry T.; Jesse lives in Osco; Rachel, Joab, Minnie and Jennie live at home.

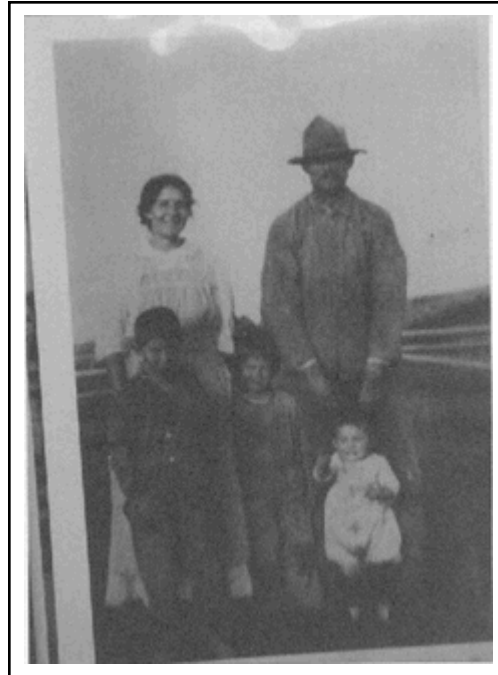

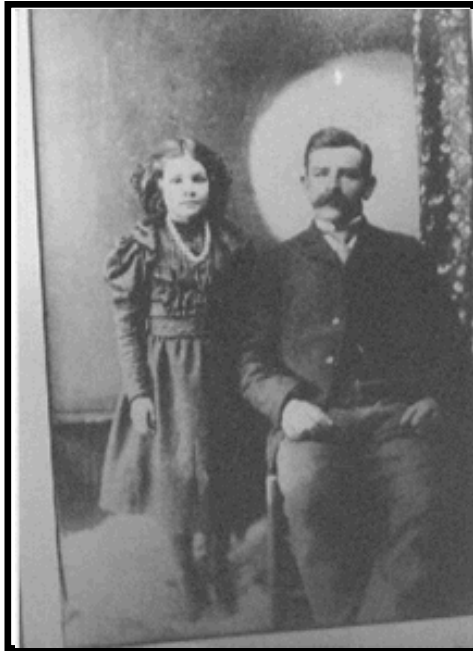

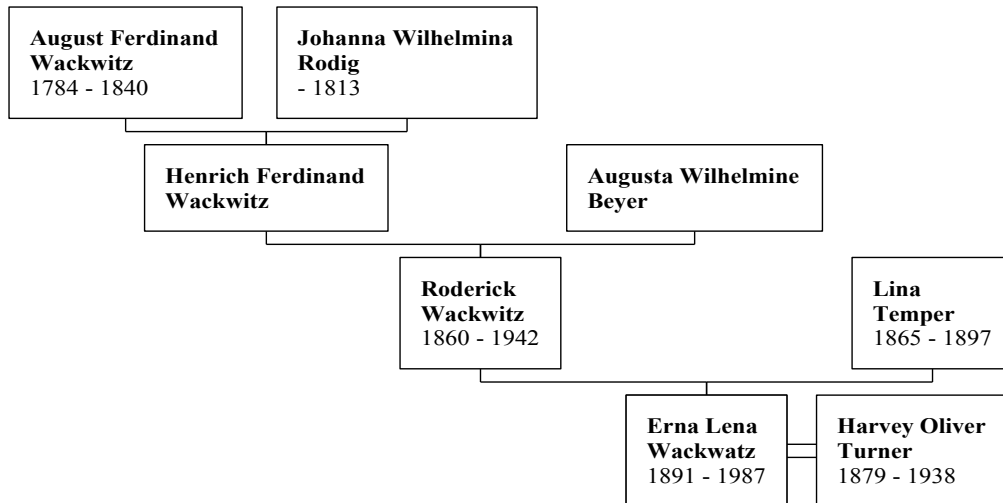

Lillian Turner: April 22, 1918 to present

1918: Lil was the third child born to Harve and Erna (Wackwitz) Turner at Simpson Flats between Coalmont and Hebron, CO. Harve was foreman for Big Horn Ranch school section.

1920: The Turner family homesteaded what became known as the Turner ranch. The first building they lived in was a trapper's cabin. More additions were added on as the family continued to grow. Lil had 9 brothers and sisters. Growing up Lil worked as a shepherd.

1932: Lil moved to Walden, CO for High School. Mother (Erna Turner) leased a boarding house for teachers in Walden to help with the children's education. The summer between her 2nd and 3rd year of school a horse fell on Lil and fractured her leg. Her 4th year of High School, she lived in the courthouse with the Simmons's family. For board and room she cleaned the jail and courthouse.

1936: Lil graduated from high school then spent the summer at the ranch teaching at the county school and the Butler summer school, due to blizzards that had closed the school down in the winters.

1936-38: In the fall Lil moved to Fort Collins and attended Colorado Agriculture and Mechanical School (A&M), what is now Colorado State University (CSU).

1938-40: Lil lived outside Ft. Collins and worked for a family for room and board for the 4 years she went to college. She finished in 1940 with a Bachelor of Science.

1941-42: Lil taught school in Coalmont, and the Butler School. Several of her sisters and brothers were in her classes. She applied to Columbia Presbyterian School of Nursing in New York and was accepted.

1942: She moved to Bryn Mawr, Pennsylvania and attended Bryn Mawr College for probation classes for 6 months.

1942-44: Lil attended Columbia Presbyterian, in New York for nurses training. She graduated from Columbia University with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing Education. She stayed on in New York working until State Boards in the early spring of 1945.

She arrived at Paraque, Philippines (a replacement depot), (part of Potential Japanese invasion troops). In June she was assigned to Fort McKinley (now Fort Bonifacio), Manila for four months. 1946: In August she went to the ranch in Colorado for a short time then moved to Fairbanks, Alaska to go back to school for 1 year.

1947-48: Lil worked at Group Health Hospital in Seattle, Washington.

1948-50: Back to Fairbanks at U of A, she was campus nurse, Dean of Women and worked for the Fairbanks clinic in the summer. The clinic sent her on a 14 hour flight to Troutdale, OR with a patient for Edgefield Mental Institute.

1950: Lil moved back to Seattle to work at Group Health Hospital for four years.

1954-60: She did 3 tours of duty for the Department of Interior working in Samoa (Government of American Samoa) as adviser to the Chief Nurse.

1956: During her time in Samoa she went to New Zealand for R & R. Lil also traveled with Aunt Lottie and her friend for 6 weeks in Europe, visiting France, Denmark, Germany, Holland, Switzerland and Austria.

1960: She came home from last tour to work as a nurse at Twin Falls Memorial Hospital, in Twin Falls, Idaho, for 1 year.

1961-62: Then she was asked to work for Standard Oil (Logo Oil and Transport Co.) as a shift supervisor in the hospital in Aruba.

1963-64: From Aruba, Lil flew to Washington DC to interview for a job in Vietnam. While waiting to hear if she got the job to go to Vietnam, she worked at the Indian Service Hospital in Gallup, New Mexico for 8 months as a Public Health nurse.

1964-69: In April she flew to Danang, Vietnam for 2 tours of duty that covered four years as a Lieutenant Commander.

1969-70: Lil lived in Honolulu, Hawaii working at Queen's Hospital and going to the University of Hawaii for a semester as a graduate student.

1970-72: Back to Vietnam to work at Cho Quan Hospital in the China sector of Saigon for 2 years.

1972-74: Lil was asked to work on the Truk Islands for 2 years as adviser to the Chief Nurse, working for the Government of Trust Territories.

1975: April saw Lil back to Saigon to work at Children's Medical Relief International Hospital for 4 months when the Vietnam War ended. Lil flew out of the country the week before the people were being flown off the roof top of the US Embassy.

During the years Lil was in Vietnam she traveled in country and also did R & R in the Philippines, Tiapa, Singapore, Hong Kong, Panang, Quala Lampuro, Malaysia, Bali, Thailand, Bangkok and Shanghai. She spent 2 months at Clark Field in the Philippines with pneumonia. When she was recovering she traveled to Baguio, Bontoc and Benaue in Northern Luzon.

1975: Lil moved to Hanna, Wyoming to live with her sister, Millie and be closer to her mother, Erna. She worked as a nurse at the Hanna clinic for Dr. Kolff for 6 months.

1976: She commuted from Hanna to Rawlins, Wy, and worked at the Wagon Circle Clinic for Dr. Klein. At the same time she was accepted into the University of Utah for Physician's Assistant schooling which took 2 years to complete. She was an alternate student allowed to work while attending school.

1978: Lil graduated from PA school and passed her National examines for licensed PA that year.

1978-88: Lil worked as a PA in Rawlins with Dr. Klein at the Wagon Circle Clinic until he moved to Laramie.

1989-96: Lillian Turner, PA. moved back to Hanna to work as the only medical person in the area at the Hanna Clinic.

1996-06: Lil retired in Hanna, WY and spent winters in Ephrata, WA.

2006: Lil moved to Ephrata, WA to live with Dan and Sally Hubbs (her niece) and travel from here.

1974: Lil received a Metal of Commendation from the Ministry of Health from South Vietnam.

1974: Lil received a metal from the United States Public Health Service for her service in Vietnam.

1981: Lil was selected as Wyoming's Physicians Assistant of the year.

1982: Lil received National Physician's Assistant Humanitarian of the year award.

1996: Selected by the Columbia Presbyterian Hospital Alumni Association as outstanding nurse of the year.

Wackwitz notes:

Roderick Wackwitz and Lena Temper were originally from Westfallen, Vogtland or thereabouts.

Ernest Wackwitz lived with a grandmother in Zwickau, Germany after their father remarried. Erna lived with an Uncle Martin, Plauen, Vogtland, Germany.

Charlie was left in the states, living with the Wagners, 1900 census, Seward, Logan, Oklahoma. Adam Wagner was a relative of the family. Census had the family as Adam Wagner, born in Germany, Aug 1851, came to the USA in 1873, his wife was Emma, who was also born in Germany, 1849. I haven't found immigration records for either of them.

Fred was with a William Voight, no relationship, Spring Creek, Logan, Oklahoma. The Voights were also from Germany. 1900 census.

Who is Oscar Wackwitz???

The tombstone of Oscar R. Wackwitz stands as a lonely reminder of a city that once was. Cleary City, Alaska was once a thriving mining community with churches, schools, restaurants and hospitals. And a cemetery.

The cemetery, long ago abandoned with the death of Cleary City, has one grave site still enclosed in fencing, although no marker remains. There are many panels of fencing that have fallen to the ground. Some of these have been stacked vertically in several places. There is one lone wooden cross (pictured in the October Taproot,) and the stub of another. There are two or three other sites which are obviously graves. But there are no markers. The only legible marker remaining is that of Oscar R. Wackwitz, a World War I veteran who died in 1924. His marble marker was made to withstand the rigors of time. It stands as a lone

sentinel, marking the final resting place of dozens – perhaps even hundreds – of pioneer gold miners and their families.

Oscar Wackwitz was the youngest of four brothers who came to Alaska during the Gold Rush to seek their fortune. The two older brothers, Charles and Fred, came first. The records show they were here by 1917 when they signed up for the World War I draft registration. They were 28 and 27. Ernest and Oscar, then 23 and 21, registered in Jackson County, Colorado, where Oscar was listed as a coal miner in the 1920 census, and Ernest was a hired hand on a stock ranch. By 1920, Charles and Fred were mining for gold at Cleary City, some 20 miles north of Fairbanks. By 1930, Ernest had joined them.

Their parents, Roderich Wackwitz and Lina Temper Wackwitz, were born in Saxony, Germany – Roderich in 1860 and Lina in 1865. Around 1880, the young married couple immigrated to the United States. Charles Roderick Wackwitz was born September 22, 1888 in Norwood, Missouri. A year later, on November 26, 1889, Fred Martin Wackwitz was born, also in Norwood, Missouri. Their only sister, Erna Wackwitz, was born July 23, 1891 in Edmond, Oklahoma. Two years later they were in Edmond, Oklahoma, where Ernest Herbert Wackwitz was born on September 26, 1893. About three years later, the youngest son, Oscar R. Wackwitz, was born, also in Oklahoma. The following year, their mother died, leaving five children ranging from baby Oscar to nine-year-old Charles. Her tombstone, in Waterloo Cemetery, Oklahoma County, reads,

WACKWITZ, Lina

11/18/1865 10/15/1897

“wife of R.”

“She was – but words are wanting to say what,
Think what a wife should be, She was that.”

The 1900 census found 11-year-old Charles listed as an adopted son in the home of a Herman & Prima Wagner in Seward Township, Logan County, Oklahoma, and 10-year-old Fred is listed as a boarder in the household of William & Mary Wright in Spring Creek Township in Logan County. As of this writing, it is not known whether Oscar and Ernest were still with their father or were living with other families. We do know that Roderich married again on the 29th of January, 1901, to Elise Steudemann, and they had a daughter, Charlotte Wackwitz, born October 16, 1901 – possibly in Germany.

It is not known whether the other brothers served in the 1st World War, but Oscar served in the 127th Field Artillery, 34th Division, and was discharged as a Private First Class. He returned to Colorado after the war, then followed his brothers to the gold fields north of Fairbanks.

On November 21st, 1924, Oscar Wackwitz took his own life. He was 28 years old. His marble marker looks so out of place among the jumble of fallen fencing and unmarked graves. Perhaps his family wanted it to have a permanence to somehow make up for the young life that was cut short. One can only wonder what would cause a young man with his whole life ahead of him to choose to end his life. As this was being written, we learned of an article that was published regarding Oscar’s suicide. There was no opportunity to look up the article before writing this. Perhaps it will yield some clue. Perhaps not.

Oscar's brothers remained at Cleary for some years after his death. Ernest married Mary Beth Green, a schoolteacher from the Fairbanks area. They were affiliated with the Wyoming Mine on Red Rock Creek in Cleary. The University of Alaska Anchorage has a collection of photographs, taken between 1933 and 1935, relating to their home, family and friends. As far as we know, Fred and Charles never married. Charles died May 21, 1971, and is buried at Birch Hill Cemetery in Fairbanks. Fred died in September of 1981. It is not known at this time where he was buried. Ernest and Beth died in 1977 and 1987 in Bowie, Maryland.

Maybe one day Oscar's tombstone will no longer look so out of place among the remnants of an abandoned cemetery. The Cemetery Preservation Project committee has been thinking about the possibility of restoring this cemetery, possibly with the help of the Boy Scouts. We are looking for sources to fund the project. We'll keep you posted on our progress.

Beth Wackwitz (born Green) was a schoolteacher from the Fairbanks area of Alaska. She was married to Ernest H. Wackwitz, a German miner. The couple was affiliated with the Wyoming Mine on Red Rock Creek, in Cleary, Alaska. Friends and relatives visited often from 1933 through 1935, taking part in the couple's rustic life style.

This collection contains 35 black and white photographs relating to Beth and Ernie Wackwitz's home in Fairbanks area. Included are images of the Wackwitz home, family and friends, the Fairbanks Ice Carnival, Wyoming Mine, Circle City, and a local wedding. The collection also contains 9 black and white 4 X 5 conservation negatives made from selected prints in the collection.

This collection was acquired by the archives in January 2001.

silver from placer mining at No Grub Creek. Hydraulic giants and bulldozers delivered 28,000 cubic yards of gravel to a bedrock sluice plate (4. by 52 feet).

Gold was produced from placer mining in the Fairbanks district by Cliff Mining Co., Caribou Creek; Sleeper & McCharles, Buckeye Creek; Albert Patrick, Ester Creek; Ernest L. Maurer, First Chance Creek; and Helmer Johnson, Cleary Creek.

Fred M. Wackwitz recovered a small quantity of gold from a test run made from placer mining at Bedrock Creek. Gold-bearing gravel was delivered to an elevated sluice box with a power shovel; tailing and overburden were removed by bulldozer. Tin and tungsten concentrates recovered as byproducts of gold-placer mining were stockpiled until sufficient quantities accumulated to warrant separation. In addition, prospecting was continued in an attempt to discover the lode source of placer tin. Flume Creek mine, also owned by Fred Wackwitz, made a test shipment of lead ore from lode deposits at Flume Creek.

Lead.—The only activity in lead in Alaska in 1952 was a test shipment by Fred Wackwitz of 2 tons of lead ore to a smelter in the United States. The lead ore was produced from a lode prospect on Cleary Creek adjacent to the Cleary Hill mine in the Fairbanks district. (See tables 1, 6, and 9—14.) The Riverside mine near Hyder in Southeastern Alaska, the major producer of lead in Alaska before 1951, remained active in 1952.

The Fort Knox Mine—1,200 Ounces A Day by Ron Wendt

“The largest lode production from mines in the immediate True North area came from the Soo property, also known as the Spaulding, patented in 1913. From 1912 to 1914, this mine produced \$75,000 to \$100,000 with the gold price at \$20.67 per ounce. Other lode mines and prospects in the True North area are the Newsboy, Sunrise, Robinson, Hidden Treasure, and Dome View. The Dome View was staked in 1917, on the north flank of Pedro Dome at the 2,000-foot elevation by the Wackwitz Brothers. The adit was 145 feet long and attained a depth of 100 feet. The vein was 12 to 40 inches wide, averaging 30 inches.”

Just a note, the information on Peter King is purely speculative, the information was on a Peter King of the right time and place.

Any information any of the family can add is very welcome, along with stories and photos I can add to the Turner History.
